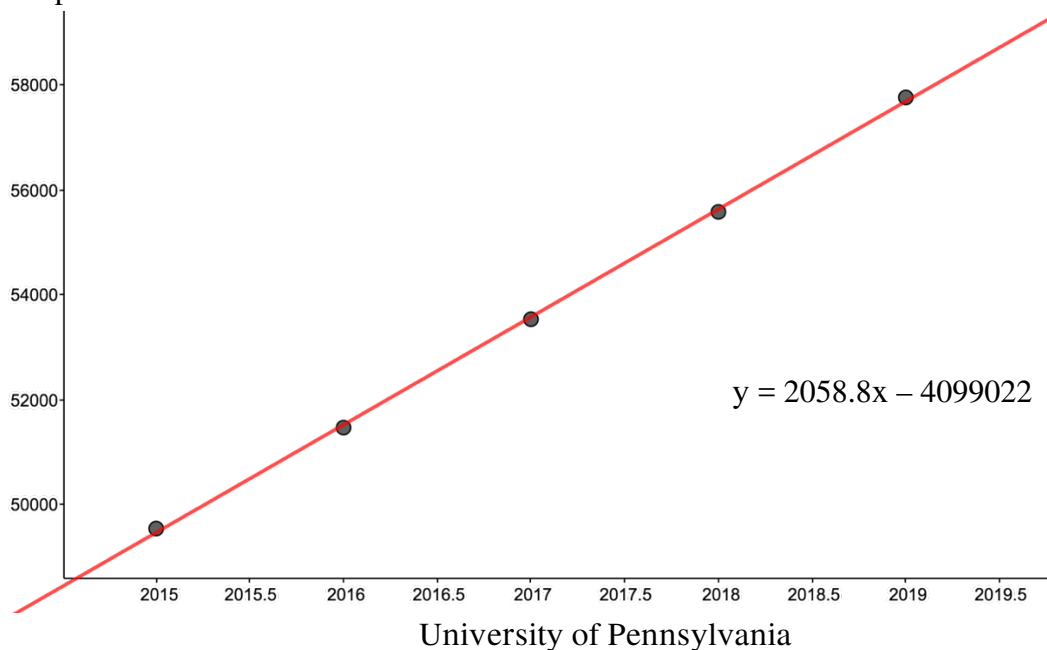

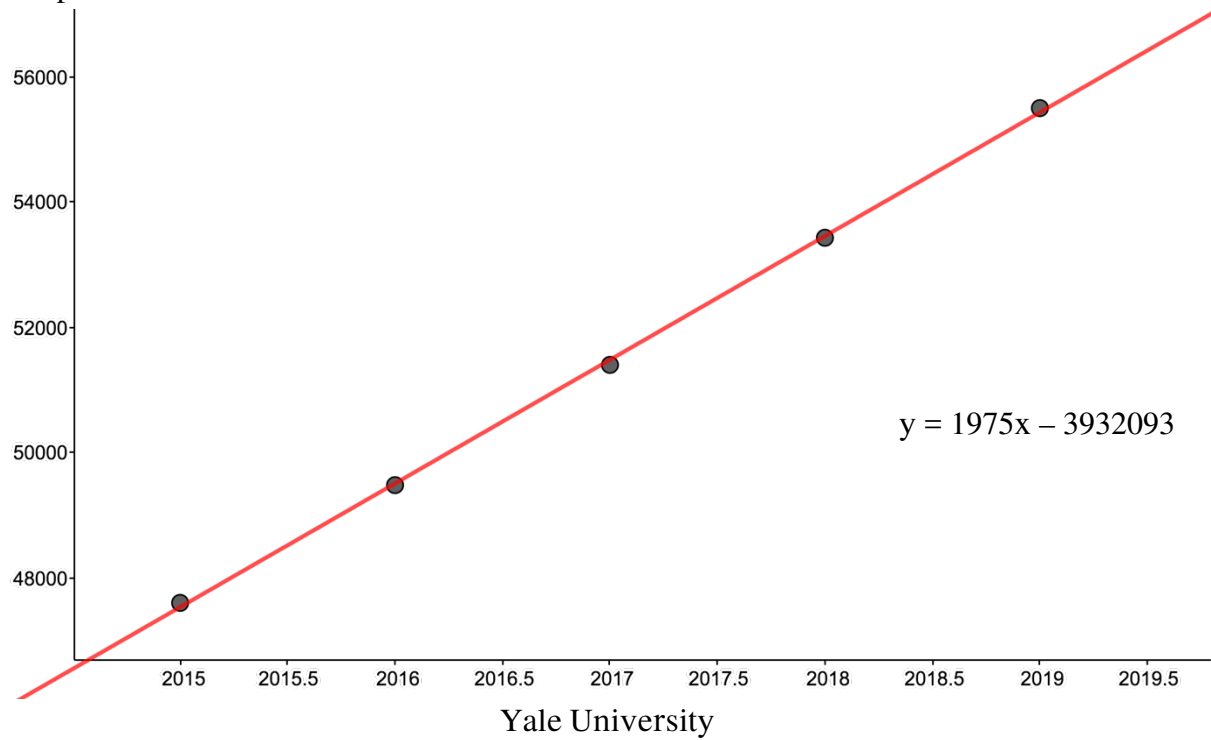

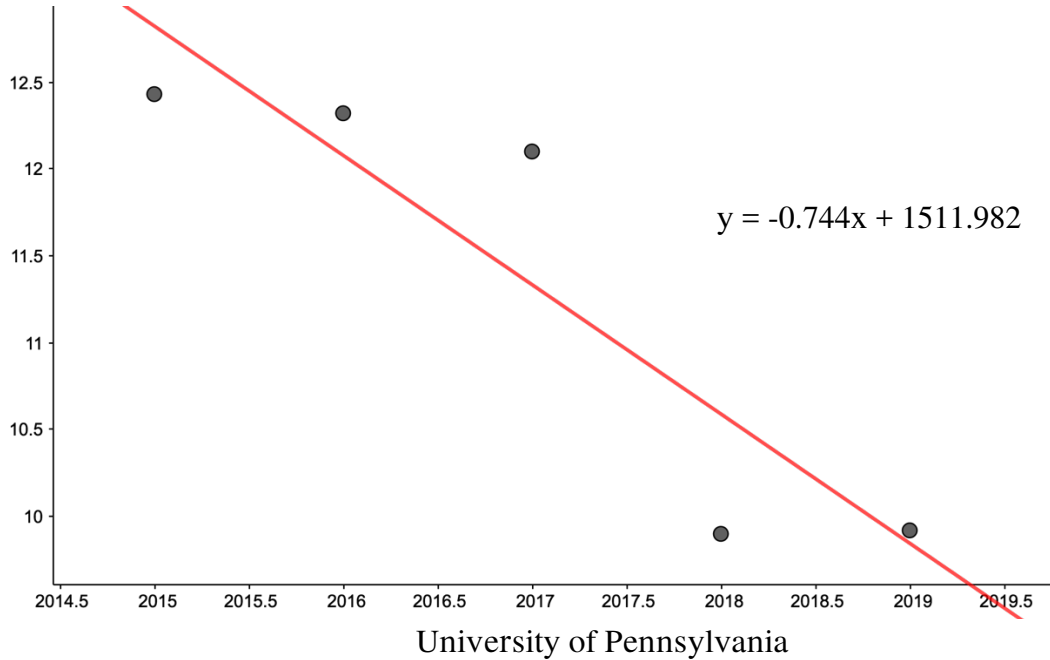

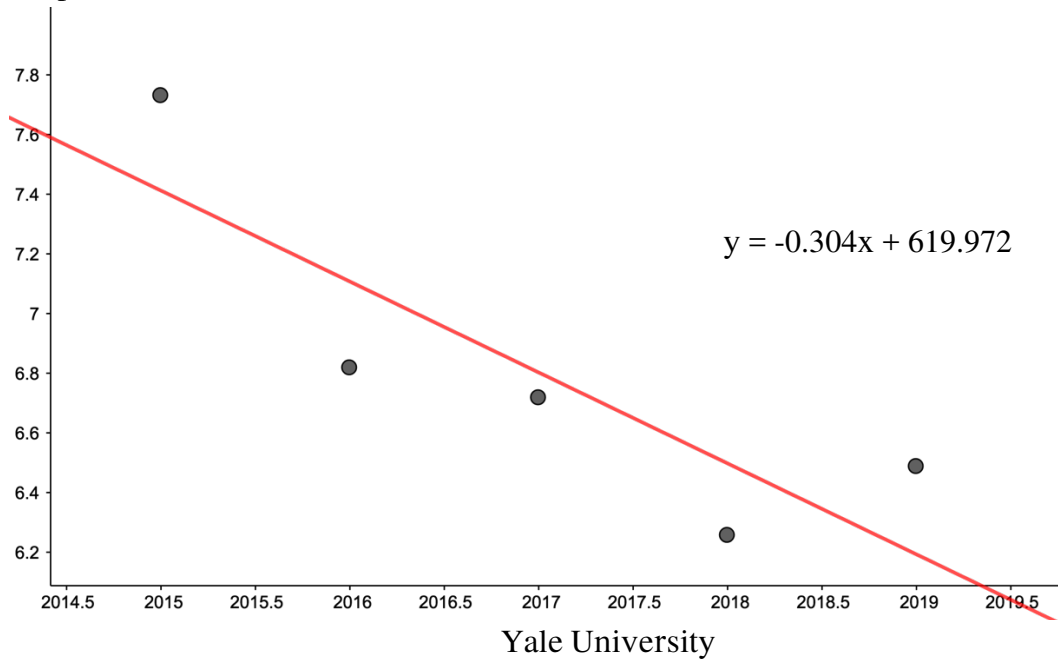

REPORT ON OPTIONS

There have always been dilemmas when we choose our dream school. Hence, the final result must be a really careful choice considering many aspects like tuition and fee, acceptance rate, population of the city, crime rates of the city, etc. Based on statistics we can then get a very logical and thoughtful choice. University of Pennsylvania (UPenn) and Yale University (Yale) are both really good schools, but there are still advantages and disadvantages about each of them.

UPenn's tuition and fees is more expensive than Yale university, around \$2000. However, the acceptance rate in UPenn is also greater than Yale. In 2021 the acceptance rate in UPenn is 8.36%, and Yale's acceptance rate is 5.59%, according to the lines of best fit in the graphs. It seems like a close value to each other but in real life this 3% might be thousands of people. Based on tuition and acceptance rate, I think I will choose UPenn because there is a much higher chance to be accepted and the tuition is not very much higher than Yale.

When comparing and contrasting Philadelphia and New Haven, I am most concerned about crime and crime rates, because I think safety is the most important thing. The total number of annual crimes in Philadelphia is much greater than New Haven, but the crime rate is smaller and the crime index is also smaller. In addition, the per capita income and the median household income is greater than New Haven. However, the educational attainment and the education industry in New Haven is a lot better than Philadelphia, which is also very important because education is the main reason why I wanted to study in America. With a good education atmosphere, I believe I can learn better.

Based on the analysis in the previous paragraphs, I think my choice would still be University of Pennsylvania, because of its higher acceptance rate, lower crime rates and higher income. Yale and UPenn are both in the Ivy League, which means that the education atmosphere is not going to be horrible. With all variables considered, the University of Pennsylvania is more suitable for me.

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
